Parade Laps at Roebling Road in September - Ok, ok, I know several of you are probably tired of some of us talking about what fun we're having on the track. If you're just not sure what it's all about, check out an event as close to Charleston as you can get and with another PCA Region close to our hearts. The Coastal Empire Region PCA will be hosting their Fall Driver's Education Event at Roebling Road Raceway on September 22-23, 2012. As much as the Coastal Empire Group would like you to participate in the full DE, as a part of the Palmetto Region PCA Board's continued efforts for 2012 to expose members to Driver's Education Events, we have arranged for Parade Laps to be a part of this event around Roebling Road Raceway during the lunch hour on Saturday. The Parade Laps are run at a reduced speed (approx. 45 mph) and windows must be down. If you've been to the track to watch before, Parade Laps are a great way to see the whole track through the windshield rather than just behind the fence in certain corners. The track takes on a different perspective as a driver making the best of each corner even at relatively slow speeds. Your P-car is not required to participate in Parade Laps, but I think it would enjoy them.

Since Joe and I will be at Roebling on Friday afternoon, we are looking for a volunteer(s) to lead a group from Charleston to the Track on Saturday morning, September 22. Once you arrive and sign the entry waiver, you can roam the infield checking out the amazing cars (the Knobe boys have enjoyed this before!) and watching the action on the track. The lunch hour on Saturday is from Noon to 1 pm. Roebling has a concession stand with reasonably priced items (burgers, sandwiches, chips, drinks). You may want to bring your hat, sunglasses, sunscreen, water, and a chair (there are no stands for spectators). No alcohol is allowed until the track goes cold at 5 pm.

Also, note for the September Event, if you have been considering trying a Driver's Education Program for the first time but are concerned about purchasing a helmet and then not wanting to continue, we have something for you. The Coastal Empire Region has a limited number of helmets for you to wear at this event, free of charge. Registration is now open on www.clubregistration.net. Special rates for lodging are available (\$69 + tax) at the Hampton Inn & Suites Savannah Airport (912-966-1240). When making your reservation, please make sure you mention you are part of the Coastal Empire Region event. 

GERMAN RECIPE

"Bauernbrot - A Receipe for German Farmer's Bread"

So far, this is one of the easiest recipes for recreating the German bread experience. This bread uses half white and half whole wheat flours, some sourdough for taste, and caraway seeds. Two rises make this bread light and easy slice. It's perfect for serving with soup or for Abendbrot. This bread freezes well.

Prep Time: 4 hours Cook Time: 40 min Total Time: 4 hours, 40 min *INGREDIENTS*:

 $2^{\frac{1}{2}}$ c. white flour (all purpose or bread flour)

2 ½ c. whole wheat flour (such as white whole wheat flour from King Arthur)

2 tsp. salt

1 ½ tsp. instant yeast

1 c. milk mixed with 1 T. vinegar (sour milk)

¹/₄ c. sourdough culture (optional)

½ c. rolled oats from King Arthur)

2 tsp. caraway seed 1 c. plain yogurt

1-2 T. water



PREPARATION:

Sourdough Notes: You will need to see the recipe for sourdough culture if you wish to use that ingredient.

DOUGH: Mix flours, oats, salt, caraway and instant yeast together in a large bowl. Add the sour milk, yogurt and sourdough culture and begin mixing. This is easier if you have a stand mixer, but you can do this with a large spoon, too. Mix until dough forms a ball, adding water if needed. The dough should be slightly sticky.

Continue kneading, either with the mixer or on a lightly floured board for 5-7 minutes. Let the dough rest for 5 minutes then knead again for 1 minute. Form into a smooth ball and place in an oiled bowl, turning to coat the top. Cover with a clean dish towel and let rise in a warm place until doubled.

Turn out onto a lightly floured board and form into a typical long loaf as follows:

Degas as little as possible

Pat dough into rectangle

Indent with fingertips down the middle

Fold one third to middle, lengthwise, pulling dough taut on the bottom

Press seam a little to seal

Fold other third to middle (pulling dough taut) and pinch seam closed

Roll over seam-side down and rock gently while rounding the ends and making loaf longer or fatter, as you wish.

Place on parchment paper on a baking sheet or cardboard, dust top with flour and let rise until doubled. About 30-minutes before you plan on baking, slash the top with a sharp razor blade or lame at least ¼ inch deep.

Heat oven to 500F for 1-hour prior to baking. Use a baking stone if you have it, according to manufacturer's instructions. Otherwise, place an old pan on the bottom rack and set the second rack in the middle. Place the bread on the middle rack (still on the parchment or floured baking pan), pour 2 cups of hot water into the old pan and close the door. Using a spray bottle filled with water, spray the sides of the oven after two, five and seven minutes. Turn oven down to 450F. Bake for 20 minutes. Turn oven down to 350F and bake for another 20 to 30 minutes, or until a temperature probe measure 190-200F or loaf is brown and sounds hollow when tapped. Remove and let cool 2 hours before slicing.

Featured Member—"Louise Piech" By Jackie Dasen



Since I didn't have anyone lined up for this month's "Featured Member" I decided on a member of

the Porsche family.

Louise Piech (August 29, 1904 – February 1, 1999) was the daughter of Ferdinand Porsche, born in Wiener Neustadt, Austria-Hungary. Her brother, five years younger, was Ferdinand Anton Ernst Porsche, otherwise known as "Ferry". In 1928, Louise married Anton Piech, a lawyer from Vienna. Anton led the Volkswagen factory in Wolfsburg from 1941 to 1945.

Louise and Anton had four children: Ernst,
Louise, Ferdinand and Hans-Michel. When Anton
died in 1952 the Austrian businesswoman imported
Porsche and Volkswagen cars to Austria. When her
son Ferdinand was in charge of Porsche's sports car
racing program in the late 1960s, a second works
team was set up called Porsche Salzburg. One of their
cars scored the marquee's first overall win at Le Mans
in 1970.

SOMETHING GERMAN "NUBLOCH"

Nubloch is a town fairly typical among small towns in Germany. There are 1-3 traffic lights, 1-2 main streets, and a few shops, loads of row houses, a main pedestrian area and a handful of churches. The town is unusual as there are two halves – the blue collar industrial portion in the southwest valley and the newer, affluent residential district in the northeast hills. Most German towns are one way or the other.

More in character with German towns, the main street is narrow and snakes through buildings that were built before the American Civil War, leav-



ing minimal room for sidewalks. Lining the streets are Mom-and-pop restaurants, gasthause (bed-and-breakfasts), metzgerel (butcher shops), conditorel (confectionary shops), and backerel/stehcafes (bakeries/standing cafes).

Germany does not share the American vigilance of separating church and state. There is a Catholic church and two Protestant churches (one Lutheran, the other Evangelistic). Each church has its service/Mass times posted on signs at the entrances to the town. This is common practice throughout Germany.

The staple of any German town is the main marketplatz, and Nubloch is no exception. Nubloch's is called Lindenplatz and is a simple square platz located right outside the *rathaus* (main municipal building). Nubloch, like most German towns, hosts a town market each week (some towns have them daily) where fresh vegetables and fruits, meats, breads and cheeses are sold. On several occasions during the year the center of the town is closed off for a festival. These festivals are lots of fun and many of the booths are local clubs that use the festivals as their primary fund-raisers.

Another point of interest in Nubloch is the Maypole. Traditionally these were used to honor a town's major families during the spring. Nowadays, it's not uncommon to see them honoring the town's major industries, sometimes to the point of the maypole being used to sell advertising space. The Maypole is always topped with a small pine tree.

Nubloch is peaceful, quiet, and friendly with plenty of activities to keep one occupied. This small German town is the temporary home of source author for this article.
