### **GERMAN RECIPE**

### Sour Cream Salad Dressing with Variations

This salad dressing recipe goes together quickly from ingredients you have in your pantry. Try it and you won't ever run out of salad dressing again. It is also lower in fat than commercial dressings and has no added sugar.

Prep Time: 5 mins. Total Time: 5 mins. Serves: 4 (about ½ salad dressing)

### Ingredients:

½ c. sour cream

½ tsp. freshly ground pepper

2 T. minced red onion (optional)

Dash cayenne pepper (option #2)

2 T. water, milk, or club soda

1/4 tsp. dried oregano

½ tsp. chili powder (option #2)

1 tsp. med sharp mustard (option #3)

#### Preparation:

Thin sour cream with water or milk to dressing consistency.

Option #1: Add broth powder (bouillion), pepper, and oregano, crushed between your fingers, and mix well. Add onion if you like. Make sure they are finely minced.

Option#2: Add in chili powder and cayenne pepper to #1. Mix well.

Option#3: Add mustard instead of chili powder.

Serve chilled.

#### Serving suggestions:

- -iceberg lettuce and tomato salad
- -with cherry tomatoes and carrot sticks as a dip
- -as a sauce for meat fondue (Fleischfondue)
- -on a shredded carrot salad
- -as a dressing for a Waldorf-style salad
- -as a topping for boiled or baked potatoes.

## **Washing your Car**


One of the most basic maintenance tasks for your car is cleaning it. While this includes the art of washing your Porsche, it also includes the reconditioning and protection of both the exterior paint and chrome and the interior.

The first step in washing your car is to determine exactly what it needs. If the car is simply dusty and has been sitting in desired. If your car does leak water, then toss some towels the garage, then you probably only need to wash it with plain water (no soap). Wet the car down and use a wash mitt to remove any dust that might have settled on the car inside the garage. When washing the car, remember to get the valance panels and the lower rockers. As these panels are closest to the ground, they have a tendency to get the dirtiest.

I don't recommended using a chamois to dry your car. The chamois can trap small particles of dirt in its porous material and can actually cause scratches in the surface of the paint when it's used to dry off the car. A really good alternative is 100 percent cotton terry towels. Make sure the towels have been washed at least once, and don't use a rinse or softener. The softener is an additive that can cause streaks, and it inhibits the towel's absorbency.

If your car suffers from more than simple dust accumulation, then you will need to use a bit of car wash soap. Make sure that you don't use normal household soap or detergent, as this will remove the wax from the surface of the paint. As the wax is oil-based, normal detergents will attack and remove it. The car wash soaps are very mild and shouldn't remove the layer of wax that you have on your car.

Rinse the car completely with water from a hose,



After the car is completely rinsed, start drying it immediately. The new thing for drying cars has become the use of blowing the excess water of the car with a ShopVac on reverse or a leaf blower. While these are both fine remember, if you use a ShopVac in blower mode, make sure the filter is clean or you will just end up washing your car again, and if you are using a leaf blower that is gas powered make sure it does not vent its exhaust gases out through the blower nozzle.

It's best to dry the car off out of the reach of sunlight. Pull the car into the garage and dry it off in there. Removing the car from the sun helps keep those ugly water spots from appear-

# Feature Member David Terry

My name is David Terry and I'm quite a late comer to the Porsche brand. I originally started looking at 911's around 20 years ago shortly after moving to the US from England. I started researching which led me to what I think was a Bruce Anderson book that had an Arena Red 993 on the cover. That still remains one of my favorite street Porsches. I decided that I couldn't really swing the kind of car I wanted financially so I ended up going the two wheel route and buying a Ducati motorcycle. That got me diverted from the four wheel scene for a while as I started doing track days on the bike, progressed to club racing with a series of Hondas and Suzuki's. I did get a ride in a race prepped Porsche GT3 at VIR when I was there coaching one weekend at the Patriot course. I was amazed at the corner speed and how late you could brake compared to my 750 race bike. Around 2005 I started looking at fun cars again and had a Cobra replica built, lots of fun. Had a Roushe 502r racing engine put in it, but very impractical. My fiancee, now my wife, kept burning her legs on the side exhaust pipes, so at this point in my life having figured out "happy wife = happy life" started thinking about a more practical, but still fun car. I had the Cobra up for sale, when a guy called me from Kansas, who turned out to be a Porsche dealer. Well, this seemed like fate, so we worked out a deal and one day a transporter arrived with my new 997.1 S Cabriolet, and left with the Cobra. The neighbors were I think happier than me, that Cobra was loud. I did a couple of track days with a group of folks that rented out the Talledega track, but when the guy I was following spun out in T1 and ended up going through a bank of trees into a river (thankfully the right way up, it was also the passengers first ever time on the track as well) I decided to stick to the road. I started looking at the 997 GTS, and Baker had one that I nearly pulled the trigger on but I really wanted PDK. I got a call from

Lee Clagett, a really good guy at Baker, about the 991s they had. Went up there with my wife, took a test drive over the bridge and back. I know PDK is one of those con-

troversial subjects, especially now since the 991 GT3 does not even have a manual option, but my mind was set when I hit the sport plus button, and floored



the gas peddle, wow, and what I loved even more was the rev matching and burbling sound on down shifts. So, thats how I ended up with the car that y'all designed, thank you very much for your excellent taste! I did a PCA track day just before Christmas at Roebling road and had a blast. Would love to figure out a way to get a track dedicated Porsche, I'm working with my wife/CFO to get her to go ahead! I had Autometrics install H&R springs to close the gap in the wheel wells and I have 7mm spacers on the front, 15mm on the rear. Pleasant details did the Expel film on the front half of the car, tinted it, and did the solar protection on the wind screen. They also Hydro dipped the front spoiler for a carbon fiber effect. Both companies did great work. I'm doing a couple of other cosmetic things, to me the rear looks a bit cluttered with all the lettering, so I'm going to simplify that, probably by replacing the Carrera 911s line with just 911s. I have a carbon fiber replacement for the rear plastic diffuser on order, and I'm considering having the exhaust tips ceramic coated in matt black. If anyone know a company that can do this locally I would love to hear from you. Anyway, I've gone on too long. I look forward to meeting more of you at Palmetto region events and cars and coffee.


