The smiles were wide and happy as the cars pulled out at the start of the rally but those smiles were tenfold at the conclusion. President Ben Mieke's navigator was tickled pink when I told him he could keep the Porsche hat we let him use while riding in Ben's convertible 911. Ken's navigator also took home a hat. They were just a small token that added to the joy and happiness these navigators got to experience through the generous use of our beloved Porsche's. It's like the saying says "its not just the cars. It's the people." Well that day our people made a lot of other people very happy.

If you're like me, and you love admiring your Porsche try imagining riding in one without being able to see what it looks like. And these cars do get some heads turning. 
