

Turn Nine

The weekend of October 17-18, Jennifer and I assisted the Coastal Empire Region PCA and local BMW Club in hosting two Tire Rack Street Survival schools. The **Tire Rack Street Survival** school is a program designed to go beyond today's required driver's education and give teens across the U.S. the driving tools and hands-on experience to become safer, smarter drivers.

Last year, over **5,000** teenagers died in motor vehicle crashes, the leading killer of American youths aged **16 to 19**, accounting for more than 40 percent of fatalities in that age bracket. To reduce this number, Tire Rack Street Survival has developed a non-profit, national driver education program aimed at teaching teens the skills they need to stay alive behind the wheel.

2003 was the pilot year for Tire Rack Street Survival and several successful schools were held around the country. Growing from over a dozen schools held during 2004, there have been more than 100 held in recent years from New Hampshire to California and Florida to Minnesota. The Program Director, Bill Wade, told us there were 8 schools going on that weekend and they would make over 800 total completed since inception.

Saturday morning 20 teens, along with many of their parents, showed up in the Paddock of the Hutchinson Island racetrack in Savannah, GA. After registration, all students were given a tire pressure gauge and asked to get with an instructor and tech their cars. Instructors showed students how to open the hood, inspect belts, and make sure the battery is secure. The tire gauge was then put to use as students were shown where to find the decal showing correct tire pressures. Once pressures were determined, tire pressures and adjust as needed.

Students have to provide their own car for the class and were encouraged to bring the car they normally drive. Beyond the basic on-site tech inspection, no preparation was required. When they register, the car description is required as the program tries to limit certain high center of gravity vehicles. At this event, there was a wide variety of family automobiles present – small compacts (Civic, Hyundai) to sedans (Accord, G37) and SUV's (MDX and Chevy Traverse).

Following the tech inspection, students were divided into two groups. The first group paired up with instructors for the driving portion while the other half took a seat for the classroom portion. The nervous energy quickly faded into excitement as the students were told of the different driving

exercises they would be doing throughout the day.

The first element was a

panic braking exercise, where students had to engage ABS while stopping in a straight line. The element was later changed to incorporate a 90 degree turn while engaging ABS. I had a student driving a car with no ABS. By the end of the day, he was proficient at threshold braking. Other elements included a Chicago box, a skid pad, a slalom, and a single and double emergency lane change.

Each group completed a morning classroom and driving session before enjoying a provided box lunch. Following lunch, there was a demonstration involving an 18 wheeler and blind spots. All students were allowed to sit inside an 18 wheeler to see for themselves where all the blind spots are located. More entertainment followed when the organizers set off an airbag (outside of a car) with a water bottle launched from the force of the explosion. It was an eye-opener for all – loud and an amazing amount of hang-time for that water bottle!

Another classroom session and driving exercise for each group made up the afternoon. To keep the driving exercises fresh, students were told to attempt many of the driving exercise while talking on the cell phone or texting. For all students, the added distractions were a real eye opener. Let's just say that the distracted driving killed MANY cones.

Sunday saw 10 new students complete the same curriculum. By the end of the weekend, 30 teens had a new real world skill set that will hopefully allow them to reduce dangerous scenarios on the road or be able to successfully navigate an emergency situation. The Coastal Empire Region PCA is looking to host another school in the spring and the SCCA has previously hosted schools in Charleston.



Eintopf

Eintopf means "one pot". There are as many recipes for Eintopf as there are cooks in Germany, but this one is my favorite. I use a loop of smoked turkey sausage to cut down on the fat. Also, the frozen French-cut green beans are rarely available in my small town, so I often use the canned variety. They are almost as good

Ingredients

Servings 12 Units US

1 lb Polish sausage, partly skinned
1 lb carrot, scraped and sliced
10 potatoes, peeled and diced
1 (16 ounce) bag frozen French-cut green beans

2 onions, peel and slice
10 cups water (you can use all or part chicken broth as well)
1/4 teaspoon fines herbes, dried
salt
pepper
maggi seasoning



Directions

Put the first six ingredients into a pot and bring to a boil. Reduce heat and simmer for about 1 hour. Add the herbs. Adjust the seasoning with salt, pepper and Maggi seasoning. Creativity is encouraged.
