We left at 10:30 am and zipped up to Columbia in about 1½ hours. From there to Road Atlanta was another 3 hours-- good time for 330 miles. We arrived about an hour before practice ended on Saturday. No camping was allowed on the track site because the facilities were not complete, but there were camping areas about a quarter of a mile away so no problem.

Saturday night was spent renewing old acquaintances, mostly with the group from Carolinas Region, who were very hospitable to us-- sharing food, drinks, tents, or anything else we needed.

At about 6:00 am we got ready for the fight to get in, but had no trouble getting in or getting a good spot to park. The track is definitely a spectators paradise. There were 50,000 people there and it wasn't really crowded. The facilities were outstanding and they were not even finished. Definitely the best and prettiest track I've seen.

Can-Am racing is spectacular to say the least, and to have a Porsche 908 win the first Can-Am that I attended was superior planning. Anyone can read the race statistics in Autoweek so I won't go into details, except to say Porsche won and the

track is beautiful. It is hilly and spectators can see a lot of the track from one spot. I plan to go back to Road Atlanta for the ARRC in November. It should be fantastic.

ARRC is a national event held annually to determine national winners in all SCCA classes. The top 3 drivers in points standings for each class in each division will meet for the big run-off. This year it will be at Road Atlanta from the 23-29 of November.
