## Turn 9 by Joe Mills

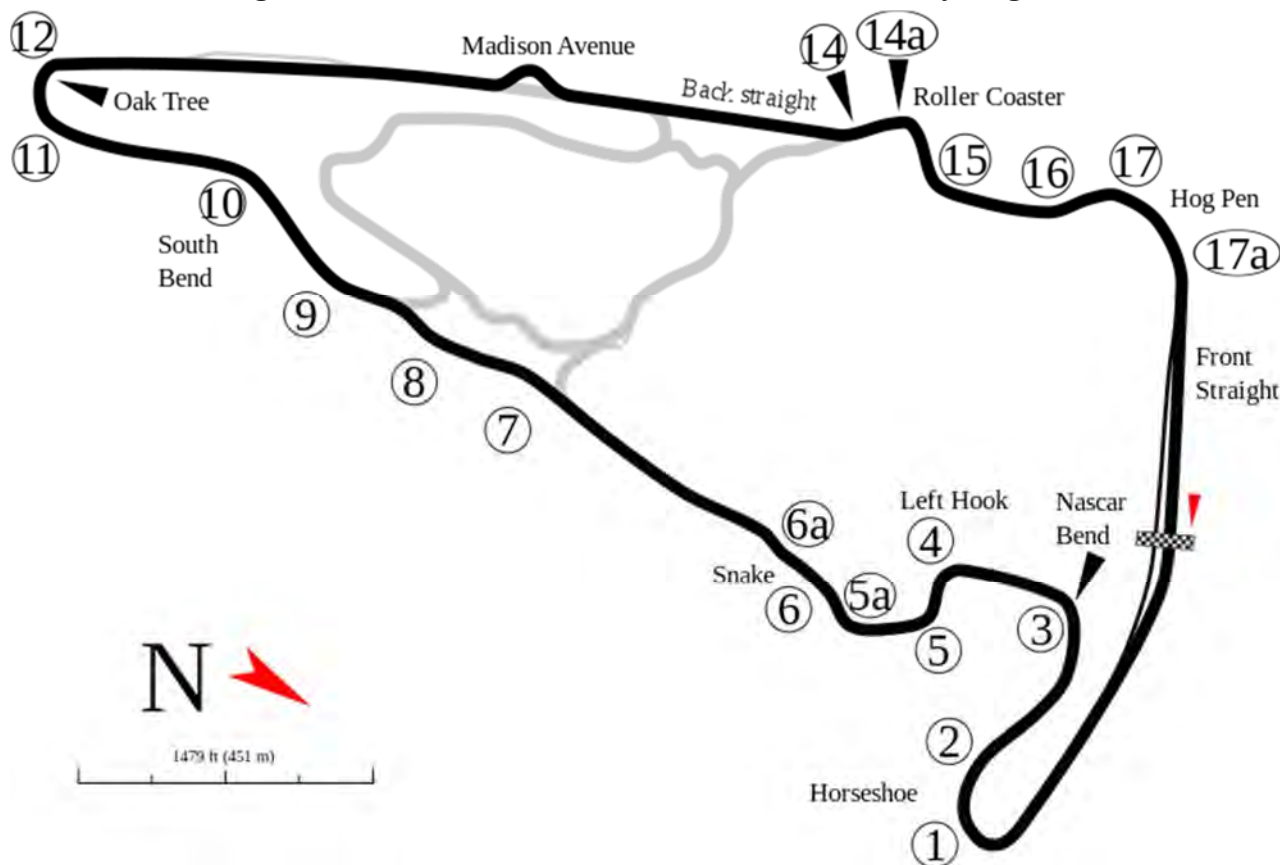
There have not been any DE's since the last newsletter, so there is not much to report from the track. However, there are three upcoming events at Roebing Road Raceway. Florida Crown Region is hosting an event on April 18-19. The Dark side, a spin off from PCA, is hosting an event on May 2-3 and Coastal Empire Region is hosting an event on June 6-7. The Dark side still offers Taste of the Track, where for \$25, you can ride along with any of the instructors for the day. If you are interested in driving, riding or watching, come on down and join us for the day.

Since I don't have anything to report, I thought I would highlight VIRginia International Raceway, one of the best known tracks in the nation, which happens to sit right in our back yard.

Recently chosen as one of Car and Driver Magazine's top six road courses in the nation, VIRginia International Raceway is a multi-purpose road course offering professional and amateur auto and motorcycle racing, as well as a wide range of track events. Each year, VIR draws tens of thousands of spectators for some of the best road racing in the country. Its uphill Esses and sharp elevation changes not only make it a fan and driver favorite, but have also established it as a prominent testing facility for the automotive industry. While racing is the heart of VIR, the expansive 1,300-acre property located at the Virginia-North Carolina border is so much more. America's first true "motorsport resort," it's an entire vacation destination with a number of onsite hotel and lodging options. Within the property's rolling hills and miles of lush forest, guests can enjoy unique amenities such as the exclusive Driver's Club, karting, off-road racing, skeet shooting, pistol, and rifle ranges, skid pad, dining options, spa and more.

VIR opened in 1957 as one of the country's first permanent road racing circuits and offers six track configurations, ranging from the 1.1 mile Patriot Course to the 4.2 miles Grand Course. Recognizing greatness, the 3.27-mile Full Course has remained exactly the same since, with the only change being widening some places to offer safer run-off room.

The "Full" course is the most common configuration and hosts most events throughout a season. One of the most notable sections of the course, second only to the Oak Tree (T11), are the "Climbing Esses" which consist of an initial left up-hill (T7), followed by a right which crests at the apex then dropping slightly into a left (T8) which again crests at the apex dropping slightly, and then up into a final left (T9). The complexity and difficulty of this section is multiplied by the incredible entry speed because of a straight section leading into the Climbing Esses. Most drivers agree that this section of track is among the most intimidating sections of track in North America. Another signature section is the "Roller Coaster" (T14) which is a scaled-down mirror image to the famed "Corkscrew" at Mazda Raceway Laguna Seca. ...continued next page.....



There are 2 main straights on the track. The front straight is approximately 3000 ft long while the back straight is approximately 4000 ft long. While the back straight is 33% longer, the front straight is where higher speeds are reached since "Hog Pen" (T17) leads onto it and is a much faster corner than the Oak Tree (T11) which leads onto the longer back straight. There is 130 ft of elevation change throughout the course. Some of the raceway's named curves include "Oak Tree", "Roller Coaster", "Hog Pen", "Horse Shoe", "NASCAR Bend" (because NASCAR drivers Richard Petty, David Pearson and Wendell Scott had difficulties there during a 1966 Trans Am race), "Snake", "Spiral", "Fish Hook", and "The Bitch".

I would highly recommend the trip to southern Virginia to either drive in a DE or watch one of the professional races. It truly is an amazing track!

# SOMETHING GERMAN

## 2015 Porsche Lineup

(Yahoo Autos: J.D Power and Associates, April 7, 2015)

**BOXSTER:** a 2-passenger roadster, the 2015 Porsche Boxster comes in base and S variants, as well as the new GTS. The 2015 model is little changed from the previous year, save for a



new front fascia on the GTS. The differences in trim levels are analogous to those of the 911, but at a somewhat less opulent level. The Boxster is known for its mid-engine design. It features RWD and Porsche's 7-speed automated manual transmission. The standard engine is a 2.7-liter, 265-horsepower 6-cylinder plant that cranks up to 207 lb.-ft. of torque. The Boxster S features a flat 6-cylinder of 3.4 liters, making 315 horsepower and 266 lb.-ft. of torque. The Boxster GTS features the same engine, modified to make 330 horsepower and 273 lb.-ft. of torque. All versions of the 2015 Boxster come with a menu of options, including special wheel designs, various performance features, and many custom options for the interior. **What's NEW:** GTS trim level, park-assist sensors, rearview camera, front fascia has been redesigned for GTS.

**CAYMAN:** The 2015 Porsche Cayman is little changed at most trim levels, but a new variant, the GT4 makes its debut this year. The 2014 Cayman underwent a



slew of changes, including a longer wheelbase and wider track, improved brakes and steering, upgraded seats, and a bigger trunk, plus keyless entry and ignition. The new GT4 features a 3.8-liter, flat 6-cylinder engine that makes 385 horsepower and 309 lb.-ft. of torque. It operates with a 6-speed manual transmission. Otherwise, Porsche offers the Cayman in base for equipped with a 275-horsepower, 2.7-liter 6-cylinder engine that makes 213 lb.-ft. of torque; Cayman S, fitted with a 3.4-liter, 325-horsepower 6-cylinder motor that makes 273 lb.-ft. of torque; or a GTS version that has the same engine, souped up to make 340 horsepower and 280 lbs.-ft. or torque. **What's NEW:** GT4 trim level, rearview camera and park assist sensors.

**CAYENNE:** For 2015, the Porsche Cayenne



SUV lineup features 6-cylinder engines on all but the Turbo and Turbo S versions. At the top of the line, the AWD Cayenne Turbo S delivers 570 horsepower from its twin-turbocharged, 4.8-liter V-8 engine, which can crank

out 533 lb.-ft. of torque. An 8-speed automatic transmission is standard. The company claims this high-performance variant of the Cayenne can reach 60 mph in 4.3 seconds and top out at 176 mph. Features include gloss-black 21-inch alloy wheels, electronic-locking rear differential, gauges tracking lap times and acceleration, widened wheel arches, and unique interior color combinations. Other trim levels include the base Cayenne, Cayenne Diesel, Cayenne S, Cayenne S E-Hybrid, and Cayenne GTS. **What's NEW:** Turbo S engine now makes 570 horsepower, Cayenne S 6-cylinder engine replaces last year's V-8, available air suspension adds retractable load sill, various styling tweaks to exterior, ventilated rear seats available and upgraded parking camera available.

**MACAN:** An all-new addition to the lineup for 2015,



the Porsche Macan is a compact luxury crossover SUV, smaller than the Cayenne. All-wheel drive is standard, but in most cases the power goes predominantly to the rear wheels, protecting the Macan's status as a per-

formance vehicle. The 2015 Porsche Macan comes with a choice of two V-6 engines: a 3.0-liter unit that produces 340 horsepower and 339 lb.-ft of torque, on the base Macan S; or a turbocharged, 3.6-liter 400-horsepower power plant that makes 406 lb.-ft. of torque, on the Macan Turbo. Both employ a 7-speed automated manual transmission.

Both the Macan S and Turbo feature 19-inch wheels, power lift-gate, bi-xenon headlights, dual-zone climate control, and a full menu of power accessories. The Macan S has an 11-speaker sound system; the Turbo's boasts 14 speakers. The Turbo adds LED fog lights, full leather upholstery (compared to leather and simulated suede for the S), Alcantara headliner, navigation system, upgraded sound system, and other enhancements.

Many options are available for the 2015 Macan, ei-

lights on Turbo and Turbo S, satellite radio, HD radio are standard, Porsche Online Services are standard.

911: A new, fancier trim level, the GTS, is the 911's big change for 2015. The model underwent extensive updating for 2014, including available all-wheel drive (AWD), ceramic brakes, LED headlights, and restyling of the front and rear. The base 911 is available as a coupe, retractable-hardtop Targa, or the soft-top convertible Cabriolet. Standard equipment includes 19-inch alloy wheels, automatic bi-xenon headlights, dual-zone automatic climate control, leather upholstery, navigation system, and a 9-speaker sound system. The base model features rear-wheel drive (RWD) and comes with a 3.4-liter 6-cylinder engine that makes 350 horsepower and 287 lb.-ft. of torque. The S versions, with RWD or AWD, employ a 3.8-liter 6-cylinder engine that makes 400 horsepower and 325 lb.-ft. of torque. With the optional Carrera S Power-kit, this engine can generate 430 horsepower. The various iterations of the S trim level also include 20-inch wheels, adaptive suspension dampers, and a lower ride height. The GTS includes the Power-kit as standard equipment, upgraded wheels, sport exhaust system, various performance enhancements, Alcantara upholstery, and black interior accents. An extraordinary extensive menu of individual options and option packages rounds out the offering. At the top of the line, the GT3 and 911 Turbo offer the most power, with the 911 Turbo S topping out at 586 horsepower and 516 lb.-ft. of torque. **What's NEW:** GTS trim level and rearview camera.

918 SPYDER: Porsche's all-new super-powered roadster is actually a plug-in hybrid. However, unlike more popular hybrids like the Chevrolet Volt or the Toyota Prius, the 2-passenger 918 Spyder features a removable roof panel, can be completely recharged in as few as 25 minutes using a Porsche 400-watt high-speed charging station, can travel up to 18 miles or at 93 mph on electric power alone, and is capable of accelerating from 0 to 60 mph in roughly 2.8 seconds, according to the automaker. At the heart of the 2015 Porsche 918 is a 4.6-liter V-8 engine joined by a 115-kW electric motor for the

rear wheels and a 95-kW motor for the front wheels. The system includes a Lithium-ion battery and a 7-speed dual-clutch automated manual transmission. **What's NEW:** All-new plug-in hybrid sports car, 887 horsepower and 940 lb.-ft. of torque, Porsche-estimated 211-mph top speed and 18-mile electric driving range and full recharge in as few as 25 minutes.

# GERMAN RECIPE

## BUTTERMILK SOUP WITH CHIVES

Although unusual in America, Buttermilk soup as *Buttermilchsuppe* as the Germans call it is fairly common in Germany. There are many variations of buttermilk soup recipes, some containing potatoes, some with beans and some with the addition of a seafood variety like crab. The recipe below is a basic version and I encourage you to experiment adding different favorite ingredients of your choice. Unlike most soups, buttermilk soup does not have to simmer for a long period of time to lock in the flavors. The buttermilk is quickly thickened with cornstarch and after the egg yolk is tempered back into the mixture, the soup only cooks for a few minutes more until it is ready to be garnished with chopped hard-boiled egg pieces and fresh chives and served.

**PREP TIME:** 10 minutes    **COOK TIME:** 15 minutes    **TOTAL TIME:** 25 minutes  
**YIELD:** 4-6 servings

### **INGREDIENTS:**

3 tablespoons cornstarch	4 cups buttermilk
1 tablespoon freshly chopped chives, plus more for garnish	
1 teaspoon salt	1 large egg yolk
1 large hard-boiled egg, peeled and chopped into small pieces	



### **PREPARATION:**

**In** a large saucepan, whisk cornstarch into the buttermilk until completely combined.  
**Place** the mixture over medium heat and stir the mixture constantly until it thickens.  
**Stir** in salt and freshly chopped chives.  
**Beat** the egg yolk in a small bowl.  
**Ladle** a small amount of the buttermilk mixture into the egg yolk, streaming slowly and whisking briskly to temper the yolk.  
**Pour** the tempered egg yolk mixture back into the large saucepan and stir until evenly combined.  
**Cook** the buttermilk soup for another 3-5 minutes, stirring occasionally.  
**Pour** the soup into bowls, garnish with the chopped hard-boiled egg pieces and fresh chopped chives and serve immediately.
